10. **Explore** the link between climate change, resource scarcity, and conflict in Africa.
11. **Develop** skills in **mediation**, **negotiation**, and **dialogue** for conflict resolution.
12. **Analyze** the role of civil society and youth in promoting peace and security on the continent.
13. **Formulate** policy recommendations to enhance the AU's effectiveness in achieving the "Silencing the Guns" initiative.
